# **Transferable Safety – Fact or Fiction?**

#### 5 December 2013, Hilton London Euston Hotel

The reuse of safety arguments from one domain or context to another has the potential to reduce the time, cost and risk to deployment of new systems. But do their claims stand up in the new environment?

This seminar will examine the challenges Independent Safety Assessors (ISAs) and procurers of systems face in deciding whether safety claims are fact or fiction. It provides real examples of the issues to be addressed for successful transferability, including:

- read-across of evidence (e.g. civil equipment used for military purposes)
- reuse of existing components or subsystems (e.g. COTS equipment or previously developed software)
- applicability of standards used in development
- integration of systems of systems.

The seminar includes a workshop session, allowing attendees to examine such issues for a real example application. This will give ISAs, and procurers of systems where safety is key, some important guidance on developing adequate and realistic plans to enable timely delivery of systems.

#### Cost and registration
